#### IOP Innovation



#### Could we rethink aspects of intensive outpatient program delivery in a competitive landscape?

During the height of COVID-19, programs across Colorado shifted to virtual participation by clients. This fundamentally altered the landscape. Previously, intensive outpatient programs were competing with similar local services within a narrow geographic area. Now, in a virtual environment, every intensive program in the state is vying for the same clients. By putting fresh eyes on this level of care, we were able to rethink some of the universal challenges that IOPs face and provide additional support without increasing workload for clinical staff.

One of the challenges of an IOP is that there are revolving admissions, and some people have been there months while others may be on their first day. Using the same mobile app used by our family and alumni programming, we are now able to begin to create individualized resources to complement the current acclaimed curriculum. While clients newer to the program focus on core topics of the group, those who have participated in the program for a while now get exposed to videos, audio meditations, and presented slides around the Harmony alumni program, spirituality, and family programming. In addition, worksheets can be distributed and referenced anytime and notifications for internal reflections can be done on days not in session. With this platform we can continue to build and innovate in our treatment in new ways.

This separation allows participants to fully immerse themselves in discussions, activities, and reflections tailored to address their needs and concerns. Through this intentional segregation, we have seen remarkable transformations and a heightened sense of camaraderie among the alumni and family members who participate, ultimately leading to a more harmonious and inclusive community.

## Colorado Coalition of Treatment Providers (CCTP)

This past year, we also launched a new organization that seeks to bring the substance use disorder treatment programs in the state together to work to create care that is more client-focused, efficient, and more impactful. Our CEO, Jim Geckler helped to create this new initiative and acts on the steering committee where C-level leadership collaborates to discuss innovations in care, act as a cohesive voice to the community, and provide a healthy forum for communication. 
